MITRANSFER, MITRANSFER PATHWAYS, AND MIWORKFORCE PATHWAYS

1. **What is MiTransfer.org**

Mittransfer.org is the new site for the Michigan Transfer Network, Michigan's statewide transfer site. With support from the state of Michigan, the Michigan Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (MACRAO) partnered with the Michigan Community College Association, the Michigan Association of State Universities, and the Michigan Independent Colleges and Universities to update the Michigan Transfer Network. In addition to providing information about course equivalencies, the new Michigan Transfer Network shares information about course equivalencies, the Michigan Transfer Agreement, institutional profiles, and additional information about transfer.

2. **Where can I find information about the MiTransfer Pathways?**

Faculty and administrators from Michigan's colleges and universities have worked together to develop 10 multi-institutional statewide associate to bachelor's degree MiTransfer agreements as well as 4 multi-institutional MiWorkforce Pathways. 3. **Do institutions also offer articulation agreements or transfer guides?**
